Welcoming the New Representative of Biblical Studies Program	 The president introduced the council members to Erin and the group officially welcomed her to the team. Erin signified her happiness to be part of the council and expressed her willingness to work to achieve the goals of the GSA. 		
Freshmen Orientation Issues	 The president briefed Erin on the latest student orientation progress. As per Dean Colin suggestion, program coordinators should be given more time in introducing their department. The MISSM/MISAM representative agreed on this point as he informed the group that Dr. Sergey Butakov who is the MISSM/MISAM coordinator told him that he needs 20 minutes. For her part, Ashleigh said that she thinks the time allotted in the program for the Psychology Assessment Coordinator is enough. The psychology assessment representative informed the group that as of now there are 11 registered students for her department. Samip told the council that Amaka who was slated to make a speech to the new students would not be able to make it as she is already busy with her work. Amaka, as an awardee, was supposed to inspire and encourage the new students in the pursuance of their studies. Samip, however, informed the group that Dr. Butakov has another student in mind who can replace Amaka. Samip said once this is finalized he will inform the group about this issue. Samip further said that his vice-president would be the one to represent him in his speech during the program orientation. Samip also informed the group that he will need at least four volunteers during the program orientation. These volunteers according to him can come from his own set of officers and the chairmen of the professional student organizations (ISACA and IEEE). The president apprised the group that 12 shirts will be allocated to officers. Some of these shirts will be distributed to the management representatives.
